
ARE YOU BOAT READY?

Transport for NSW also acknowledges the dedication, commitment and passion of the late Ross McKenny in his work with Aboriginal communities to improve boating safety.



Jordan earned a Bachelor of Design from UNSW Art and Design School, and has created bespoke artworks for corporate organisations, government


Aboriginal Symbols

Aboriginal art uses symbols to tell stories.


This symbol represents a Waterhole.




The three lines linking waterholes together represent **flowing water**.



This symbol represents a **Meeting Place**.






Are You Boat Ready?

A lifejacket will keep you safe on the water.




Always wear a lifejacket and have an adult check that it fits properly.




Lifejackets are for everyone, adults too.




Make sure an adult checks the weather before you head out and when you are out on the water.




Always tell an adult where you are going and what time you plan to return.




Always make sure you have enough safety equipment, including lifejackets for everyone.



Wear bright colours when you're out on the water so you are easy to see.




Falling into cold water can be very dangerous, so make sure you're prepared and always wear a lifejacket.




Having the right equipment helps to keep you safe.
